

Two Injured in Industrial Incident

Victims Airlifted from CMC Steel Texas

SEGUIN, Texas – An incident at CMC Steel Texas Sunday evening resulted in a small fire and two burn victims being airlifted to the hospital.

The incident occurred in a melting room at approximately 5:30 p.m. One victim suffered severe burns to 60-80 percent of his body and was in critical condition when airlifted from the scene. The second victim suffered severe burns to his hands. His condition was not immediately available. Both victims' burns were caused by molten material.

The McQueeney Volunteer Fire Department and Seguin Fire Department responded to the scene. When firefighters arrived, the facility's main gas line was shut off as a precautionary measure. Shortly after shutting off the line, a gas release valve activated, prompting firefighters to back off until the gas company could remedy the situation. Once back in the building, the small fire was quickly extinguished.

Employees were briefly evacuated from the immediate area of the incident, however no off-site evacuations were ordered. CMC Steel Texas will release a statement soon.
