Guadalupe Street Traffic to be Shifted

Hike and Bike Project Construction Requires Temporary Traffic Change

SEGUIN, Texas – The City of Seguin alerts drivers of a temporary traffic shift beginning soon on Guadalupe Street at the intersection of Court Street.

Traffic heading south on Guadalupe Street will be diverted into the center lane to allow for the closure of the right turn lane. All southbound traffic on Guadalupe Street will turn east, west or continue straight from the center lane.

The shift is needed to allow the Walnut Creek Hike and Bike Trail project contractor to use the right lane during construction of a pedestrian bridge. The traffic shift will begin as soon as Friday and is expected to last until early 2015.

The Walnut Creek Hike and Bike Trail project will connect New Braunfels Street to the new west side community park, downtown, Walnut Springs Park and the future library site.
