City of Seguin in Normal/Awareness Water Stage

City of Seguin water customers do not fall under the water restrictions that are being publicized by area cities. The City of Seguin is fortunate to be in its Normal/Awareness Water Stage.

In 1998 the City of Seguin took steps to secure its water supply future with the formation of the Schertz-Seguin Local Government Corporation which has developed a 12 well Carrizo Aquifer ground water supply in Gonzales County to serve the two cities. The City of Seguin also has the second oldest river right on the Guadalupe River for 7,000 acre feet of water.

These water supplies ensure adequate water for the City of Seguin for the next 50 years, insure an excellent supply of water contributing to the quality of life for our citizens, and enable economic development growth in our city at a time when water is a precious commodity across Texas.

Although the City of Seguin is fortunate to have diverse water sources that mitigate the impact of these drought conditions, the City of Seguin recognizes that water is a valuable natural resource and should not be wasted; therefore residents are encouraged to adhere to the guidelines of the Normal/Awareness Stage.

The guidelines are as follows:

- Water landscape during the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. (*Watering with reuse water is exempt from reduction measures.*)
- Soaker hoses and watering by hand are permitted.
- Look for ways to voluntarily reduce water consumption.
- Conserve water as the waste of water is prohibited.
