

## **Downed Line Causes Brief Power Outage**

***Repairs Completed Within 45 Minutes***

**SEGUIN, Texas** – A downed line led to a power outage that affected approximately 650 City of Seguin Utility customers Monday morning. The outage lasted approximately 45 minutes and affected an area primarily between Seguin High School and Schriever.

City of Seguin Utility crews were dispatched to the scene on Schriever at approximately 9:15am and repairs were completed at approximately 10am. Crews determined a corroded splice gave out, causing the line to fall across the street.

Seguin High School was affected and was in contact with the City of Seguin during the outage. Seguin ISD reported the high school's power was restored at 10am.
