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

The following streets are closed to through traffic:

- ⇒ Nolte St. from Crockett St. to Erskine St.
- ⇒ Milam St. from Donegan St. to Nolte St.

Portions of the following streets may be closed periodically at miscellaneous locations:

- ⇒ Mountain St. from River St. to Bauer St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ Bauer St. from Court St. to Mountain St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ San Marcos St. from Court St. to Mountain St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ Milam St. from Gonzales St. to Mountain St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ River St. from College St. to Mountain St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ College St. from Austin St. to River Street (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ Elm St. from Austin St. to River St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ Ireland St. from Austin St. to River St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ Mosheim St. from Austin St. to River St. (miscellaneous portions)
- ⇒ Walnut St. from Austin St. to River St. (miscellaneous portions)

The contractor is working diligently to complete the residential services, drain structures and supplementary items along the streets marked with a red dotted line. Once that work is complete, work on the road can begin. These streets may be closed at miscellaneous locations during the next several weeks, depending on the location of crews.

The streets marked with a solid red line will remain closed until further notice as crews continue work in the area.

Boring near the 700 block of East Court Street led to the discovery of several voids under the street. These voids, likely caused by years of small streams of flowing water, resulted in small portions of the street slightly sinking. Work was stopped as TxDOT was notified. The agency brought ground-penetrating radar to examine the area. A plan of action was established that called for traffic control devices and metal plates to be placed over portions of the street as the boring continued.

Late last week, an old clay sewer line collapsed in the same area. This called for an emergency sewer pump-around. Pending a Tuesday morning meeting with TxDOT, we anticipate the contractor starting the repair of that line early this week.

The street will be repaired and traffic returned to normal once the culvert is installed and the sewer line is repaired. We thank everyone for their patience while work on this vital utility project continues.



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
