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

The following streets are closed to through traffic:

- ⇒ Nolte St. from Crockett St. to Erskine St.
- ⇒ Milam St. from Donegan St. to Nolte St.
- ⇒ All streets highlighted in yellow are considered closed to thru traffic. Black arrows indicate traffic pattern (see legend).

ROAD CONSTRUCTION:

River Street: Street compaction continues from College Street to Mountain Street in preparation for asphalt paving. *Tentatively scheduled for late June to July.

Mountain Street: Street construction has started in the area between River and Milam Streets. **Access to City Hall utilizing Mountain Street is closed at this time.** Once this area is compacted to the required specification, work will progress east to San Marcos Street.

WATER INSTALLATION:

San Marcos Street: The water crew continues to install the new water line on San Marcos Street and is currently in the vicinity between Ireland and College Streets. Installation will progress north to Kingsbury Street. **Motorists may experience daily block closures. Residents will be notified in advance of scheduled water outages by door hanger.**

DRAINAGE INSTALLATION:

San Marcos Street at Mountain Street: The drainage crew is installing the storm drain and inlets behind the water crew. (A sewer crew will soon begin behind the drainage crew to complete all new underground utility installation on San Marcos Street). Dates are not yet available.

Court Street Drainage Channel: The man made tunnel found underneath Court Street (State Highway 90A) near the auto parts stores was grouted (filled-in) on Monday, May 11, 2015, as required by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) (the road is owned and maintained by TxDOT), and the concurrence of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). TxDOT personnel were on site to witness the process. Pending (grout) curing time, the contractor will resume pushing the 6 x 6 box culverts underneath the road for the next 2-3 weeks* beginning on **Monday, May 18th.** **Note: The traffic diversion on this portion of Court Street will remain in place for this duration.**
