

Thank you for your correspondence dated September 21, 2009 and your responses to our email request for more information describing the above referenced project. This letter serves as comment on the proposed undertaking from the State Historic Preservation Officer, the Executive Director of the Texas Historical Commission.

The review staff, led by Kim Barker, has completed its review of the project documentation provided. The project area consists of the 100-block of S. Camp Street and the south side of the 200-block of W. Donegon Street. Part of the project area is within the National Register-listed Seguin Commercial Historic District. It is our understanding that the proposed work will consist of sidewalk construction to meet accessibility standards as well as the installation of pavers, tree plantings, and reproduction light fixtures.

As noted in our previous correspondence of 2003 and 2005 regarding this multi-phased project, we rarely recommend the installation of pavers, tree plantings and light fixtures in applications and designs that are not historically accurate. However, we previously allowed the installation of these features with certain conditions. Based on this documentation, our staff has determined that the project will have no adverse effect on the above-referenced property if the following conditions are met:

- New trees must be the same species and scale of those planted in the 2003 *Phase I Sidewalk Improvements* project.
- New pavers should be the same color, size and shape of the pavers placed in *Phase I*.
- New lights should be identical to those implemented in *Phase I*.
- Building protection notes should be inserted into the construction documents to prevent damage to historic materials from work during the construction process.

We look forward to further consultation with your office and hope to maintain a partnership that will foster effective historic preservation. Thank you for your cooperation in this federal review process, and for your efforts to preserve the irreplaceable heritage of Texas. **If you have any questions concerning our review or if we can be of further assistance, please contact Kim Barker at 512/463-8952.**



Description: The Seguin Sidewalk Improvements Project, Phase II Ramps will provide infrastructure activities/improvements in the form of handicap ramp construction in support of the City of Seguin Downtown Historic District Main Street Project Area. The end result will be the construction of handicap ramps in existing sidewalks and the repair of driveways due to construction. Overall, existing slum and blight conditions will be eliminated.

Construction: Construction of the project is set to take approximately two months, once appropriate contracts have been signed. The time frame is April 2012 through June 2012.






