WHAT'S GOING ON?

SEWER:

The main line sewer installation has been completed along Twin Oak East. There are a few services that still need to be installed in this location. The contractor continues to install the sewer along Twin Oak West and has now begun to make the installation along Martindale Road, which will then lead into Burr Oak. ***Please watch for single lane roads and flagmen in this area of Martindale Road***

We have not received sewer tap location forms the majority of residents on Burr Oak.

CONCRETE:

The driveway replacement continues throughout the neighborhood. The next scheduled location is along the eastern part of Lone Oak and will head west. The contractor will be in contact with you regarding driveway access and completion.

STREETS:

The street/dirt work will resume after a few weeks as the sewer installation is completed. Residents should anticipate the street work to proceed through May/June of 2013.
