

## **Water Outage Scheduled for July 7** *Approximately 100 Homes Affected*

**SEGUIN, Texas** – Residents of Donegan Street, Cedar Parkway and the Glen Cove subdivision will be affected by a water outage on Monday, July 7. Barring unforeseen problems, water will be shut off at 9 a.m. and tentatively be restored by 1 p.m.

The outage is necessary to preform work on the water line at Donegan and Milam streets. The work is part of phase one of the River-San Marcos-Heideke project.

The contractor, Jordan Foster, is placing door hanger notices on the approximately 100 affected homes.

**What:** Water Outage

**Where:** Donegan Street, Cedar Parkway and Glen Cove Subdivision

**When:** Monday, July 7, 2014

**Duration:** Pending unforeseen problems, water will be shut off at 9 a.m. and tentatively restored by 1 p.m.

**Why:** Jordan Foster, as part of the River-San Marcos-Heideke (RSMH) Phase I project, needs to isolate (cut and cap) the water line at Donegan and Milam.
