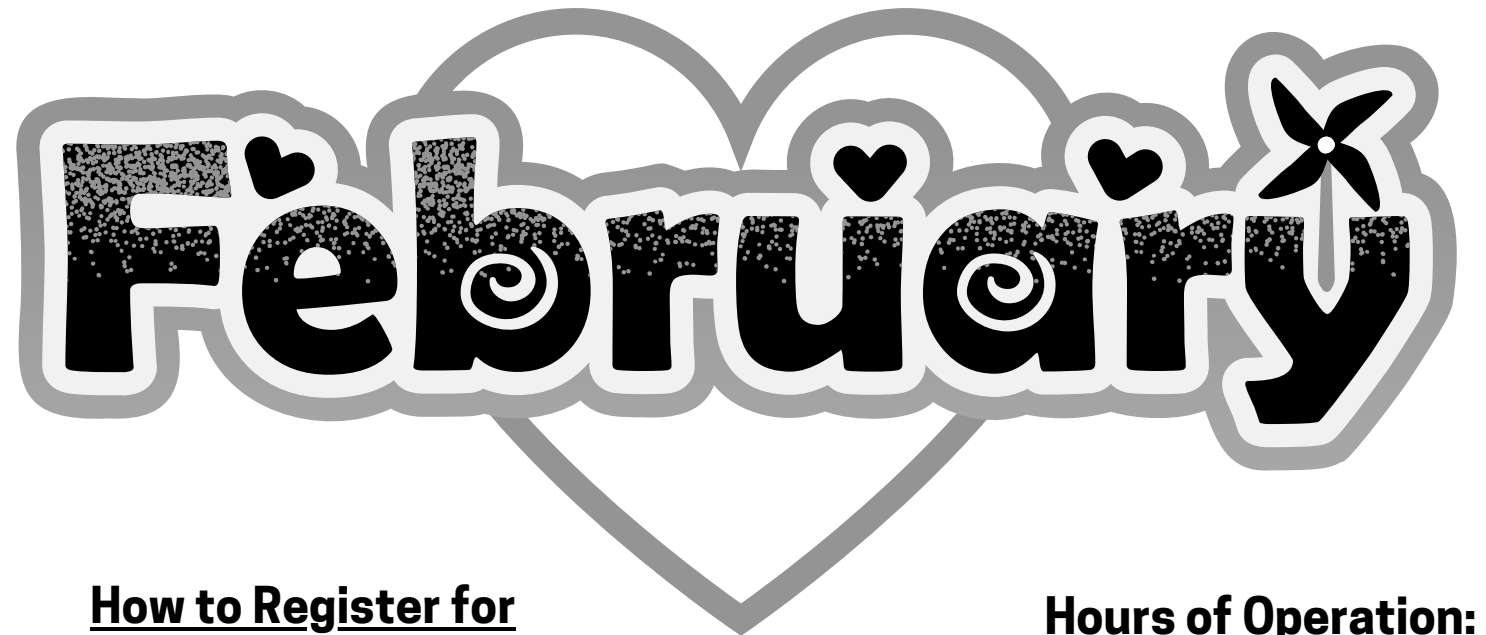

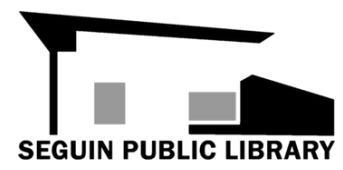

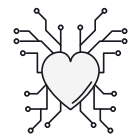
Nature Walk: Discover Recycling & Preserving Water -
